

The History of Little League Baseball in Laguna Beach

THE FIRST 50 YEARS 1952-2002

Little League Baseball was organized in Pennsylvania in 1939 and arrived in Laguna Beach thirteen years later. The Optimist Club of Laguna Beach researched the program and persuaded three other local service clubs to join them in starting our league, the third league to be chartered in California and the oldest league in Orange County.

Four teams were organized in 1952 sponsored by the four service clubs: Optimist, Kiwanis, Lions, and Rotary. Joe Roberts was elected the first league president, Nolan Doss was the first majors commissioner, and Jack Norworth was appointed honorary league president. Tryouts were held and the first teams had players from ages 8 to 12 years of age. The first home game was played on Tuesday, June 3, 1952 where the current high school diamond is located with Lions taking Rotary by a 10-3 score. Steve Ramsey hit the first home run.



Two more teams were added in 1953 and the last two in 1954. From 1954 to 1970, the league divided into two 4-team leagues that held a playoff to determine the "City" championship. The National League represented the El Morro Elementary School attendance area (north of Thalia) while the American League was represented by the Aliso Elementary School attendance area (south of Thalia).

Lions, VFW, Rotary, and Ray & Al's were National's teams with Kiwanis, Laguna Federal, Optimist, and Elks represented the American League.

For most of the years, the leagues shared playing facilities, issued one combined yearbook, had a combined opening day ceremonies, but had separate boards, charter, and all-star teams. The two leagues re-unified in 1971.

Minor Leagues were established in 1954 and were supervised by Laguna Beach City Recreation until 1989. Senior league was originally the separate Babe Ruth League from 1957-76 but was absorbed by Laguna Beach Little League under the Senior League banner in 1977. T-Ball, originally a program of the Boys Club was transferred to LBLL in 1999. Damon Berryhill (Kiwanis, 1975-76) is the only Laguna Little League player to make it to the Major Leagues. A 9-year veteran as a catcher, Berryhill did make an appearance in a World Series for Atlanta.

Peterpaul Ott (1895-1992) was a Czechoslovakian artist and sculptor who

visited California in 1939 and moved to Laguna Beach the following year. He

remained here his entire life, living in Canyon Acres and raising five children.

Serving as President for two terms. Ed is also an active member of the Laguna Beach Rotary Club and a grandpa to two Laguna Beach High School students.

Why did you choose to serve on the board? "I had an interest in history, particularly U.S. history from an early age. However, I wasn't motivated enough to really pursue my interest until my undergraduate courses at Wheaton College in Wheaton, IL. My interest grew exponentially when I taught U.S. History at middle school, high school, community college, and university, all in the Chicago area.

Why do you think your position on the board is a good match for you? "Quite by happenstance, I visited the bungalow shortly after moving to Laguna Beach. I attended a few historical society meetings and was asked by the president at the time to serve on the Board. I had never specialized in local history but with my background was strongly encouraged to run."

What is your favorite part of working with the LB Historical Society? "Learning about Laguna and what a wonderful place it is to live."


