Visitors young and old access historical resources to gain perspectives on Laguna Beach

In June, El Morro 3rd graders explored the rooms of the Murphy Smith Bungalow with clipboards, pencils, teachers, and parent chaperones. One of their lessons was to compare the similarities and differences between their own homes to the historic bungalow on Ocean Avenue.

Dee Perry who helped organize this says "Learning about their city is part of the state social studies curriculum and our students are so lucky to have such a beautiful city to learn about and wonderful citizens that enjoy sharing their knowledge. I believe it helps our young people cherish our Laguna Beach."

Carefully written and illustrated thank you notes following their visit displayed items that stood out for these 8 and 9-year-olds such as the dollhouse, the small kitchen, and the even smaller bed. They also wrote about the necessities of 1920s life: a sewing machine, meat grinders, ice box, typewriter, and dial-up telephone. They were interested in who lived there and were excited to learn more about their towns history.

As the world changes around us and Laguna Beach adapts to these changes, our history and memories remain intact. As a local non-profit, volunteer organization we aim to keep our unique history and memories alive at the "Little Bungalow on Ocean Avenue."
